What is the overall deductible?	Medical & Prescription Drug Deductible: \$5,000 member/ \$10,000 family Benefits are administered on a calendar year basis.	Generally you must pay all the costs up to the <u>deductible</u> amount before this <u>plan</u> begins to pay. If you have other family members on the policy, they have to meet their own individual <u>deductible</u> until the overall family <u>deductible</u> amount has been met.
Are there services covered before you meet your <u>deductible</u> ?	Yes: preventive care, routine eye exams, are covered before you meet your <u>deductibles</u> .	This <b>plan</b> covers some items and services even if you haven't yet met the <b>deductible</b> amount. But, a <b>copayment</b> or <b>coinsurance</b> may apply. For example, this <b>plan</b> covers certain <b>preventive services</b> without <b>cost sharing</b> and before you meet your <b>deductible</b> . Are there other <u>deductibles</u> for specific services?	No.	You don't have to meet <u>deductibles</u> for specific services
What is the <u>out-of-pocket</u> <u>limit</u> for this <u>plan</u> ?	\$7,500 member/ \$15,000 family	The <u>out-of-pocket limit</u> is the most you could pay in a year for covered services. If you have other family members in this <u>plan</u> , they have to meet their own <u>out-of-pocket limit</u> until the overall family <u>out-of-pocket limit</u> has been met.

What is not included in the out-of-pocket limit?	<b>Premiums</b> , <b>balance-billing</b> charges, and health care this <b>plan</b> doesn't cover.	Even though you pay these expenses, they don't count toward the out-of-pocket limit.

You will pay less if you use a <b>provider</b> in the <b>plan's network</b> . You will pay the most if you use an <b>out-of-network provider</b> , and you might receive a bill from a <b>provider</b> for the difference between the provider's charge and what your <b>plan</b> pays ( <b>balance-billing</b> ). Be aware, your <b>network provider</b> might use an <b>out-of-network provider</b> for some services (such as lab work). Check with your <b>provider</b> before you get services.
Do you need a <u>referral</u> to see a <u>specialist</u> ?	Yes	This <u>plan</u> will pay some or all of the costs to see a <u>specialist</u> for covered services but only if you have a <u>referral</u> before you see the <u>specialist</u> .

## Does this plan meet the Minimum Value Standard? Yes

If your **plan** doesn't meet the **Minimum Value Standards**, you may be eligible for a **premium tax credit** to help you pay for a **plan** through the **Marketplace**.

### Does this plan provide Minimum Essential Coverage? Yes

<u>Minimum Essential Coverage</u> generally includes <u>plans</u>, <u>health insurance</u> available through the <u>Marketplace</u> or other individual market policies, Medicare, Medicaid, CHIP, TRICARE, and certain other coverage. If you are eligible for certain types of <u>Minimum Essential Coverage</u>, you may not be eligible for the <u>premium tax credit</u>.
